SCHEDULE 1 – Notice of intention to hold a public assembly

(Clause 13 (1))

(Summary *Offences Act 1988*, [section 23](#))

To: The Commissioner of Police

I, Susan Abbott (Sue), of (*insert Scone address*), on behalf of the Punk Commute Ride notify the Commissioner of Police that on the Twentieth of May 2011, it is intended to hold:

*(b) a public assembly, being a procession of approximately 10-50 persons, which will assemble at the Sydney Town Hall at approximately 1200hrs, and disperse at approximately 1300hrs. At approximately 1315hrs the procession will commence and proceed: along Park Street, until the College Street traffic lights intersection where the procession will turn left onto the separate cycleway on College Street before leaving it where it terminates, joining College Street briefly before turning right into Macquarie Street, finally stopping at Parliament House. It is envisaged that it will take approximately 15-20mins to cycle the approximately 2kms from Sydney Town Hall. At Parliament House written recommendations concerning bicycle helmet regulations will be delivered to an appropriate person from the Parliament House building, given that the 20th May 2011 is not a ‘sitting day,’ before the assembly disperses.

The purpose of the proposed assembly is to first, thank the Lord Mayor of Sydney for her role in alleviating urban traffic congestion with implementation of various cycleways, and secondly to relay to Parliament of NSW the need for revocation of mandatory bicycle helmet laws.

The following special characteristics associated with the assembly would be useful for the Commissioner of Police to be aware of in regulating the flow of traffic or in regulating the assembly:

*(a) There will be as many bicycles as there are participants (i.e. if there are 10 participants it is envisaged there will be 10 bicycles, therefore if there are 20 participants there could be 20 bicycles and so on):

*(b) There will be 2 – 3 speakers addressing the assembly with a hand-held megaphone.
